# (53) Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) – **17 March 2015**To the Minister of Education, Higher Education and Research

According to the Auditor General of Québec, for the fiscal year ended on 30 April 2014, the Université du Québec à Montréal (UQAM) violated Bill 100, An Act to implement certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 30 March 2010, reduce the debt and return to a balanced budget in 2013-2014.

The UQAM granted 85 executives \$352,767 in lump sum settlements in addition to the maximum salary provided for in the Act. The department had then informed the UQAM that it had to comply with the Act, failing which it risked a subsidy reduction.

The UQAM has always denied having violated the Act in spite of the department's warning. Has the Minister of Education taken steps to recover the UQAM's overpayments?

### (58) Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) – **14 April 2015**

To the Minister for Transport and the Implementation of the Maritime Strategy

The Minister for Transport and the Implementation of the Maritime Strategy says that his Government will invest more than \$1.5 billion by 2020 within the framework of the maritime strategy.

Page B.160 of the document entitled "The Québec Economic Plan", tabled by the Minister of Finance last 26 March, indicates that Budget 2015-2016 provides for a budget allowance of over \$1.5 billion for the 2015-2020 period.

Can the Minister confirm that there are significant differences between Government investment and a budget allowance?

Can he provide details regarding this \$1.5 billion budget allowance by clearly indicating:

- the Québec Government's share of investment (in \$ millions) by indicating the form (loans, subsidies, tax credits, etc.)
- the share of private investment (in \$ millions)
- the Federal Government's share of investment (in \$ millions)
- the share of any other investment.

## (59) Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) – **14 April 2015**

To the Minister for Transport and the Implementation of the Maritime Strategy

The Minister for Transport and the Implementation of the Maritime Strategy says that a broad consultation of maritime sector stakeholders was carried out during the preparation of the Québec Government's maritime strategy.

On several occasions he indicated that he had received approximately 80 briefs within the framework of this consultation. However, no documentation is available.

Why did the Minister choose to hold a private consultation rather than hold a public consultation? Can he provide us with the list of briefs he received and make them public? Can he provide us with the list of groups he met, including the dates of these meetings and the costs related thereto, within the framework of his maritime strategy?

Once the maritime strategy will have been tabled in June 2015, does he intend to hold a public consultation at the National Assembly?

# (60) Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny) – **16 April 2015**To the Minister of Families

In a survey carried out by one of my staff members last fall, we counted 119 available spaces in my riding's unsubsidized private daycare centres. These daycare centres are currently having trouble filling their available spaces and now find themselves in a precarious financial position. One of these 42-space daycare centres still has 41 available spaces.

Last 1 April, we were informed via a press release of the construction of a new Les Petits Doigts early childhood centre (CPE) facility in Repentigny. This second facility will have 32 new reduced-contribution spaces for the families of this municipality. You must realize that these new CPE spaces will have a negative impact on my riding's unsubsidized private daycare centres since we currently have too many spaces.

In his value-for-money audit report published in fall 2011, the Auditor General issued certain recommendations including the following:

"In its process for allocating reduced-contribution spaces:

• Specify and adequately quantify the childcare network's needs and priorities, make them public and assess to what degree the developed spaces meet them; [...]"

The Auditor describes certain shortcomings in the same report and mentions: "When assessing its requirements regarding reduced-contribution spaces, the department did not evaluate the number of spaces it needed to meet its priorities and those of the regions along with their location on the territory. It would have been necessary for the department to carry out a more adequate assessment and distribution of these spaces so as to subsequently optimize calls for projects and space allocation [...] Once again, the number of spaces to be allocated in order to meet these priorities was generally not quantified or located in a specific municipality."

We deplore the lack of assessment of the number of spaces required and those available for each city or region of Québec. It appears that the department continues to act without thinking of the consequences when allocating new spaces. We hope that the impact of such decisions will be taken into consideration and evaluated before new daycare spaces are announced.

Does the announcement of 32 new CPE spaces in Repentigny stem from a promise made by the previous Government or from a decision taken by the current Government?

Is the Minister aware that these new CPE spaces will compete with my region's entrepreneurs who are currently unable to fill their vacancies?

In a context of budgetary restraint, how can the construction of new CPE spaces be justified in sectors where requirements could easily be met by unsubsidized private daycare centres? Do we really have the means of acting in such manner when we consider the conclusions and recommendations contained in the Auditor General's report?

# (61) Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel) – **16 April 2015**To the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food

When the order of initiative on the farmland grabbing phenomenon was held in the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, the majority of stakeholders gave us a clear message. The left hand does not know what the right hand is doing. The data required to develop an accurate representation of the situation is available in a good number of organizations. The interpretation of this information and the capacity to have a clear and comprehensive picture are therefore highly compromised. For the sake of transparency and efficiency in order to quickly get a true picture of Québec's farmland grabbing situation, better collaboration between the various organizations (ex: land register, CPTAQ, Financière agricole) is necessary and fundamental.

How and when will the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food commit to issuing a clear directive to retrieve all of the information that is currently available within the various organizations? Can the Minister explain how he will ensure better understanding of the agricultural sector and facilitate access to information? How will he promote greater collaboration among the MAPAQ's various platforms for the transfer of information?
