By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 145, Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

— the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 38, An Act to allow the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec to carry out infrastructure projects.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 145, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources shall meet to continue its public hearings within the framework of the examination of the policy directions, activities and administrative management of the Commission de protection du territoire agricole du Québec.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Péladeau, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved a motion concerning recipients of the prizes awarded during the 2015 Patriots' Day gala dinner; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), moved a motion concerning a third road link between Québec City and Lévis; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Hamad, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, together with Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the winners of the Prix de reconnaissance awards of the Alliance des cadres de l'État for their dynamic contribution to the management of government affairs in Québec: Mr. Yves Berger, from the Ministère des Transports, in the Manager Emeritus category; Mrs. Nathalie Gagné, from the Régie de l'assurance-maladie du Québec, in the Manager Leader category; and Mrs. Christine Vigna, from the Ministère des Relations internationales et de la Francophonie, in the Young Management Talent category.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. David (Gouin) moved a motion to amend labour laws; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

— the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 37, An Act to confirm that the cement plant and maritime terminal projects in the territory of Municipalité de Port-Daniel–Gascons are subject solely to the authorizations required under section 22 of the Environment Quality Act.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 20 May 2015, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge (Chambly).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to ensure that increases to the 2015–2016 school taxes be limited to the rate of inflation.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Hamad, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, moved that Bill 43, An Act to enhance the communication of hazard-related information concerning products present in the workplace and to amend the Act respecting occupational health and safety, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 43 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 43 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 14 May 2015, on the motion moved by Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, that Bill 20, An Act to enact the Act to promote access to family medicine and specialized medicine services and to amend various legislative provisions relating to assisted procreation, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

At 3.43 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 4:30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 4.51 o'clock p.m.

Government Motions

The Assembly held the debate on the motion arising from the tabling of the International Labour Organization's Convention 138 concerning Minimum Age for Admission to Employment by Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, on 14 April 2015.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, in accordance with section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the International Labour Organization's Convention 138 concerning Minimum Age for Admission to Employment.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 57 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 32 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 28 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried. Accordingly, this commitment was approved.

The Assembly held the debate on the motion arising from the tabling of the Agreement on social security between the Government of Québec and the Government of Romania, signed in Québec City on 19 November 2013, by Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, on 25 March 2015.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, in accordance with section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the Agreement on social security between the Government of Québec and the Government of Romania, signed in Québec City on 19 November 2013.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 57 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 32 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 28 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried. Accordingly, this commitment was approved.

At 5.35 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7.36 o'clock p.m.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, informed the Assembly that the Honourable Pierre Duchesne, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 13, An Act to give effect to the Budget Speech delivered on 4 June 2014 and to various other fiscal measures, for its consideration, and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 13 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 13 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.
