ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Lisée (Rosemont) tabled:

A copy of Circular No. 2014-033 of Normes et Pratique de gestion, Tome II, of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux, concerning tariffs for meals and transportation of persons registered in a day centre or day hospital for adults and seniors with reduced autonomy.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 19 May 2015, on the motion by Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, that Bill 20, An Act to enact the Act to promote access to family medicine and specialized medicine services and to amend various legislative provisions relating to assisted procreation, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 20 was passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 20 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Health and Social Services.

The motion was carried.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), together with Mrs. David (Gouin), moved a motion concerning the sums allotted annually to former premiers; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Poëti, Minister of Transport, together with Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the Ride of Silence taking place simultaneously tonight in over 20 cities throughout Québec;

THAT the Ride emphasize the public's desire to behave responsibly as cyclists and motorists;

THAT the Government pledge to continue its awareness campaign promoting mutual respect between cyclists and motorists on our roadways;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in honour of the cyclists who lost their lives.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Lisée (Rosemont), together with Mr. Paradis (Lévis) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion to hold special consultations on Bill 44, An Act to bolster tobacco control; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), moved a motion concerning independent community organizations; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

— the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to undertake clause-byclause consideration of Bill 43, An Act to enhance the communication of hazard-related information concerning products present in the workplace and to amend the Act respecting occupational health and safety.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining a petition;
- the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to examine the annual management reports of departments and bodies and organize its proceedings;
- the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting on the Committee's report on the draft regulation concerning the Regulation respecting change of name and of other particulars of civil status for transsexual and transgender persons.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, moved the passage of Bill 33, An Act to amend the Courts of Justice Act.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 33 was passed.

At 11.30 o'clock a.m., at the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Roberge (Chambly) moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to ensure that increases to the 2015–2016 school taxes be limited to the rate of inflation.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 52 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 35 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 25 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Passage in Principle
