Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

Following an agreement reached by the parliamentary groups and the independent Members and by leave of the Assembly, it was agreed to cancel the vote by a show of hands taken 21 May 2015 and now take a division on the motion moved by Mr. Hamad, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, that Bill 42, An Act to group the Commission de l'équité salariale, the Commission des normes du travail and the Commission de la santé et de la sécurité du travail and to establish the Administrative Labour Tribunal, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 42 was passed in principle.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 27 May 2015, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that Québec does not currently have full jurisdiction over infrastructures within the federal domain;

THAT the National Assembly note that, where the Port of Québec's expansion, the Energy East pipeline project, the Enbridge Line 9B reversal initiative and the rail and marine transportation of oil are concerned, Québec finds itself in the position of a tenant on its own territory;

THAT the National Assembly affirm the primacy of Québec's jurisdiction in environmental matters.
