By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Pagé (Labelle), together with Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly extend its heartfelt congratulations to Me Lu Chan Khuong, who was elected Bâtonnière (President) of the Barreau du Québec;

THAT the National Assembly stress the importance of pursuing efforts aimed at making our justice system increasingly accessible;

THAT the National Assembly assure the new President of its full cooperation so that structuring reforms aimed at achieving this goal can begin as soon as possible.

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 36, An Act to amend various legislative provisions mainly concerning shared transportation, the Committee on Transportation and the Environment hold special consultations and public hearings on 3 and 4 June 2015, in the Louis-Hyppolite-Lafontaine Room and that, for this purpose, it hear the following organizations:

THAT, pursuant to section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the Free Trade Agreement between Canada and the Republic of Korea, signed on 22 September 2014 and in force since 1 January 2015.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 57 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 32 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 28 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried. Accordingly, this commitment was approved.
