The Assembly was called to order at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Couillard, Premier, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, moved a motion concerning school boards' re-establishing services for at-risk students; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Charbonneau, Minister responsible for Anti-Bullying, together with Mr. Rochon (Richelieu), Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Day of Non-Violence to be observed tomorrow, 2 October 2015;

THAT on this occasion, its thoughts go out to people who are victims of bullying;

THAT it recall that the phenomenon of bullying involves interaction between three people: the target, the bully and someone who can offer help: a witness, an outreach worker, a friend or family member;

THAT the Assembly encourage each and every person, regardless of age, role or status, to behave respectfully and civic-mindedly at all times, thereby making Québec a benevolent society in which everyone, without exception, can grow up and thrive.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Drainville, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning charging accessory costs paid by patients for health care or health services; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mrs. Weil, Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness, and Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that Québec has always been a haven for refugees seeking a future, peace and safety;

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the many inappropriate statements made against Syrian refugees;

THAT it voice its concern at the rise in Islamophobic, racist videos and statements flooding the social media;

THAT the National Assembly affirm that Quebecers of Muslim faith are full-fledged citizens and that the Assembly unreservedly condemns incitement to hatred and violence against any Québec citizen.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
