## **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 4 November 2015, on the motion to divide moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) within the framework of the passage in principle of Bill 59, An Act to enact the Act to prevent and combat hate speech and speech inciting violence and to amend various legislative provisions to better protect individuals, moved by Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, pursuant to Standing Order 241, Bill 59, An Act to enact the Act to prevent and combat hate speech and speech inciting violence and to amend various legislative provisions to better protect individuals, be divided into two bills:

A first bill entitled "An Act to enact the Act to prevent and combat hate speech and speech inciting violence" and comprising section 1 and section 43;

A second bill entitled "An Act to amend various legislative provisions to better protect individuals" and comprising sections 2 to 43.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

## **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, moved a motion concerning accessory fees billed by physicians; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Coiteux, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, together with Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the finalists of the "Prix reconnaissance" of the Forum des jeunes de la fonction publique québécoise;

THAT it recognize the professional commitment of Québec public service employees aged 35 or under, particularly their achievements, vitality and outstanding work within the Québec public service; THAT it reiterate the work of government department and public body managers and directors who help enhance young people's visibility within their respective organizations.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), together with Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice and Minister responsible for the Status of Women, Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly highlight the 2 November 2015 launch of the campaign "#MotsDouxPourIndestructibles / #LoveForSurvivors" to give sexual assault survivors a forum for sharing and telling their stories;

THAT the National Assembly support initiatives celebrating survivors' strength and courage and following up on the "#AgressionNonDénoncée" movement (equivalent of #BeenRapedNeverReported) started by the Fédération des femmes du Québec;

THAT the National Assembly recall the absolute necessity of breaking the silence and of deconstructing rape culture.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes) and Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), moved a motion concerning the Canadian Government's commitments; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

## Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- -- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 67, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of tourist accommodation;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 51, An Act mainly to make the administration of justice more efficient and fines for minors more deterrent;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 54, An Act to improve the legal situation of animals;
- -- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to undertake clause-byclause consideration of Bill 44, An Act to bolster tobacco control.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 13 November 2015, Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) would question Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, during an interpellation on the Minister of Health and Social Services' wish to legalize accessory fees billed to patients.
