(107) Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) – **5 November 2015**To the Minister of Health and Social Services

New metal-on-metal hip replacements were approved by Health Canada in the early 2000s. Several hundreds, even thousands of people in Québec received this type of prosthesis. However, since then, several of these prosthetic replacements have been withdrawn from the market by their manufacturer. In 2012, Health Canada issued a warning regarding all metal-on-metal prosthetic replacements.

- What exchanges did the MSSS have with Health Canada regarding the recall of this type of prosthesis?
- How many Québec patients received a DePuy brand prosthesis?
- How many Québec patients received a Biomet brand prosthesis?
- How many Québec patients received a Zimmer Durom Cup brand prosthesis?
- Did the MSSS identify the Québec patients concerned?
- Did the MSSS notify the Québec patients concerned regarding these recalls?
- What actions did the MSSS take to ensure that the Québec patients concerned by these recalls received all of the necessary information regarding this matter?
- How many Québec patients were obliged to have their metal-on-metal prosthesis removed?

(108) Mr. Lemay (Masson) – **5 November 2015**To the Minister of Forests, Wildlife and Parks

Bill 54, An Act to improve the legal situation of animals, introduced by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, lays down several new regulations and measures to protect domestic animals under the sole responsibility of the MAPAQ.

Consequently, all animals living with humans but that are under the protection of the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife and its regulations are not protected to the same extent as domestic animals.

This means that certain pets such as parrots, lizards, snakes, hamsters, guinea pigs, mice and several other so-called wild animals yet that live in captivity with humans will not be protected as, for example, dogs, cats and horses will be.

During the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 54, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food refused to extend the definition of domestic animals to include pets that are currently considered as wild animals.

Does the Minister of Wildlife find it normal that these pets, which for the most part do not even go outside of the house, are still considered as being wild animals? Does he find it acceptable that they are still subject to the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife and its regulations and that they are therefore not protected to the same extent as domestic animals? Has he made representations to his Agriculture colleague to correct this aberration?

If not, what concrete measures does he intend to take to ensure the welfare of these animals? Does he believe it should be wildlife officers who ensure the welfare of these animals and who receive and handle complaints?
