Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the 27 November 2015 sitting, on the motion moved by Mrs. Vien, Minister of Tourism, for the passage of Bill 67, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of tourist accommodation and to define a new system of governance as regards international promotion (*amended title*).

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 67 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.3 and 185, Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, together with Mr. Gendron, Member for Abitibi-Ouest and Third Vice-President, Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the Member for Brome-Missisquoi's 35-year parliamentary career.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier), together with Mr. Paradis, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), Mrs. David (Gouin) and Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to ensure that the standards governing milk protein imports are strictly applied so as to avoid weakening supply management and significantly lowering farmgate milk prices, causing major financial losses for Québec dairy producers and harming their businesses;

THAT it ask the Federal Government to close the loophole making it possible to import milk proteins from the United States.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) moved a motion concerning public gatherings and the right to demonstrate during the 21st Session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moved that Bill 80, An Act to enable municipalities to neutralize tax burden shifts onto residential immovables, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, tabled the following:
