The Assembly was called to order at 1.40 o'clock p.m.

Moment of reflection

Mr. Péladeau, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Couillard, Premier, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. David (Gouin) made some comments.

Mrs. Jean (Chicoutimi) then took the floor.

Finally, the President welcomed the new Member.

Introduction of Bills

Mr. Leitão, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

An Act to authorize the making of collective agreements with a term of more than three years in the public and parapublic sectors

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 94 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mrs. de Santis, Minister responsible for Access to Information and the Reform of Democratic Institutions, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

An Act to amend the Act respecting the National Assembly to reflect changes made to the delimitation of electoral divisions in accordance with the Notice of the establishment of the list of electoral divisions dated 12 October 2011

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 93 was introduced in the Assembly.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, together with Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT it also convey its condolences to the families of the Quebecers who perished in Ecuador;

THAT the Assembly also express its profound sadness at the devastating effects of the earthquakes that occurred on 14 and 16 April on the island of Kyushu, in Japan;

THAT it convey its condolences to the Japanese people and to the victims' families and friends;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) moved a motion concerning the sale of armoured vehicles to Saudi Arabia; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), together with Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion on tabling a bill on establishing a framework for transportation services and regulating the taxi industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles) and Mr. Roberge (Chambly), moved a motion on public education network funding; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.
