Deferred Divisions

THAT the National Assembly recognize the importance of school dropout prevention, particularly through interventions aimed at detecting and preventing learning delays in preschoolers; THAT it ask the Government to develop, over a fiveyear period, a universal, but optional, preschool system for fouryear-olds as of 2017.

THAT the National Assembly highlight the presence, in the House, of Dr. Stanley Vollant and the Innu Meshkenu walk participants;

THAT the Assembly recognize that Dr. Vollant is the initiator of this great march, whose aim is to give young people hope, stress the elders' importance and promote a better mutual understanding of the Native and non-Native cultures while encouraging an interest in adopting healthy lifestyles;

THAT the Assembly also highlight Dr. Vollant's exemplary commitment to improving the well-being of his community and of all Native communities;

THAT it convey its sincere congratulations to all the participants, who travelled the 241 kilometres between Cacouna and Wendake with Dr. Vollant on foot.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Kotto (Bourget), together with Mrs. David, Acting Minister of Culture and Communications, Mrs. Samson (Iberville) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT, in the context of Montréal's 375th anniversary celebrations, the National Assembly reiterate the French character of Québec and of the city of Montréal;

THAT it recall section 1 of the *Charter of Ville de Montréal*, which stipulates that Montréal is a French-speaking city;

THAT it recall that section 1 of the *Charter of the French language* stipulates that French is the official language of Québec;

THAT the National Assembly remind Ville de Montréal, Tourisme Montréal and the Society for the Celebrations of Montréal's 375th Anniversary that, as stipulated in the *Charter of the French language*, they must respect Montréal's French character on signs and in communications during the city's 375th anniversary celebrations. These celebrations, in 2017, will provide an opportunity to remind tourists and the whole world of the rich francophone heritage of the city of Montréal, the French metropolis of the Americas.

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 70, An Act to allow a better match between training and jobs and to facilitate labour market entry; and then, undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 75, An Act respecting the restructuring of university-sector defined benefit pension plans and amending various legislative provisions.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following committee:

— the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 92, An Act to extend the powers of the Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec and to amend various legislative provisions. Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to organize its proceedings and discuss the possibility of carrying out certain mandates;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining certain petitions.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 13 May 2016, Mr. Cloutier (Lac-Saint-Jean) would question Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, during an interpellation on the Liberal Government's improvisation and cuts in education, and its lack of vision with regard to school success.

Business Having Precedence

Estimates of Expenditure

The Assembly entered upon the limited debate on the reports from the committees that examined the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2017.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 56 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 54 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 22 minutes 36 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes to the Member for Arthabaska. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, the proceedings continued beyond 1.00 o'clock p.m.

The debate being concluded and the Assembly having disposed of the motions stating a grievance and the motion by the Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy, moved within the framework of the Budget Speech, the question was put for concurrence in the reports from the committees that examined the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2017, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
