Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Gaudreault, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly offer Albertans its support in the fight against the forest fires that are ravaging the Fort McMurray area;

THAT it salute Albertans' courage;

THAT it highlight SOPFEU's contribution and that of Québec firefighters who have left to help their colleagues.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne), together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning the TransCanada Energy East Project; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, together with Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the Société des alcools du Québec is in favour of regulatory amendments to allow grape varieties to be indicated on bottles of wine sold in grocery stores and convenience stores;

THAT it recall that many other stakeholders working in alcoholic beverage production, sales and imports are also in favour of such amendments:

THAT it ask the Government to follow up on this request by promising to change the regulations on wine bottle labelling.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 11 May 2016, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Kotto (Bourget).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm the primacy of French, the official language of Québec;

THAT it reiterate that it is the Québec Government's historical responsibility and daily duty to protect the French language;

THAT it reaffirm that the *Charter of the French language* continues to be of fundamental importance;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly acknowledge the Court of Appeal of Québec's 28 April 2015 ruling on the language of signs and that it ask the Québec Government to propose the necessary amendments to the *Charter of the French language* to ensure that the French is clearly predominant on commercial signs in Québec.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 298, she then informed the Assembly that the interpellation between Mr. Cloutier (Lac-Saint-Jean) and Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, on the Liberal Government's improvisation and cuts in education, and its lack of vision with regard to school success scheduled for Friday, 13 May 2016 is deferred until Monday, 16 May 2016, from 2.00 o'clock p.m. to 4.00 o'clock p.m.
