Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 4 October 2016, on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Rochon (Richelieu) within the framework of the debate on the passage in principle of Bill°106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions, moved by Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) tabled the following:

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the hoist motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, that Bill 106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) moved:

THAT the National Assembly demand that, in the Government's next economic update, it reduce the taxes payable by Québec taxpayers for fiscal 2016 by \$500.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 52 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 20 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 40 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned earlier in the sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, that Bill 106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 6 October 2016 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
