(1) Resuming the debate, adjourned **16 March 2006** in the name of the Minister of Government Services, on the Opening Speech delivered by the Prime Minister 14 March 2006,

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely condemn the Liberal Party Government, and more particularly the Prime Minister, for having denied on its commitments to the population of Québec.

## By the Member for Rivière-du-Loup:

THAT the National Assembly severely condemn the Government for its failure to present a plan to deal with the demographic shock.

#### By the Member for Masson:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the Liberal Government, which has not yet committed itself to having the reform of the voting process ratified by the population of Québec.

## By the Member for Gaspé:

THAT the National Assembly severely condemn the Liberal Government, which cut back in the support payment collection service administered by Revenue Québec.

#### By the Member for Ungava:

THAT the National Assembly seriously condemn the Liberal Government for its indifference and lack of comprehension of the Native Nations realities and the development of Northern Québec.

#### By the Member for Duplessis:

THAT the National Assembly condemn the Government for not having followed up on the Marine Transportation Policy.

## By the Member for Taillon:

THAT the National Assembly severely condemn the laxness of the Liberal Government in its requests to the Federal Government regarding Québec's place within the international forums.

#### By the Member for Joliette:

THAT the National Assembly condemn the Liberal Government for its laxness and its lack of leadership as regards Canadian intergovernmental affairs.

## By the Member for Saint-Hyacinthe:

THAT the National Assembly severely condemn the Liberal Government, which proves to be unable to play an exemplary role in promoting and defending the French language and which refuses to grant the Office de la langue française sufficient resources to adequately fulfill its mission.
