The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. D'Amour, Minister for Maritime Affairs, together with Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the 16th edition of Québec Marine Day, held under the banner "Speaking with one voice", and recognize the strategic importance of the marine industry as a factor in Québec's economic and social development, which must go hand-in-hand with our targets for Marine Protected Areas.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Couillard, Premier, Mr. Fortin, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline Mr. Pierre Bruneau's outstanding career on the 40th anniversary of his work as a TV anchor;

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge Mr. Bruneau's important contribution, and that of those working in the media in general, to Québec democratic life.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved a motion on police investigations of elected officials or political staff members; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) moved a motion on the Government of Québec's budgetary surpluses; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 70, An Act to allow a better match between training and jobs and to facilitate labour market entry;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 62, An Act to foster adherence to State religious neutrality and, in particular, to provide a framework for religious accommodation requests in certain bodies.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

 the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining a petition.

#### **Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly**

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 26 October 2016, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to freeze medical specialists' and general practitioners' remuneration from now until such time as this remuneration reflects Quebecers' capacity to pay;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to reinvest the amounts freed up in health and social services.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mr. Heurtel, Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, moved the passage of Bill 104, An Act to increase the number of zero-emission motor vehicles in Québec in order to reduce greenhouse gas and other pollutant emissions.

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After debate thereon, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

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At 3.12 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until the expiry of the time limit for receiving notices for debates upon adjournment.

The proceedings resumed at 3.20 o'clock p.m.

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At 3.21 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

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#### **Debates upon Adjournment**

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question by Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) to Mrs. Charbonneau, Minister responsible for Seniors and Anti-Bullying, about the treatment of residents in Québec's residential and long-term care centres.

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Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 26 October 2016 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
