The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

Presenting Reports from Committees

Mr. Auger (Champlain), Committee Chair, tabled the following:

The report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, which met on 27 and 28 September and on 3, 4, 5, 6, 18, 19, 20 and 25 October 2016 for clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 110, An Act respecting the process of negotiation of collective agreements and the settlement of disputes in the municipal sector. The report contains amendments to the bill.

Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request from Mr. Caire, Deputy Second Opposition Group House Leader, to be heard on a matter of breach of privilege or contempt.

In his notice, the Deputy Second Opposition Group House Leader alleged that the Minister of transport and Mrs. Dominique Savoie, former Deputy Minister of Transport, acted in contempt of Parliament on 18 May 2016, before the Committee on Public Administration, within the framework of the hearing on the administrative management and financial commitments of the Ministère des Transports du Québec and as a follow-up to Chapter 5 of the Auditor General's fall 2015 report. The Deputy Second Opposition Group House Leader also alleged that the Ministère des Transports and Mrs. Dominique Savoie violated sections 55(2), 55(3) and 55(4) of the *Act respecting the National Assembly*.

The President informed the Assembly that he would hear arguments at the next sitting, during Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, tabled the following:

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 25 October 2016, on the motion moved by Mr. Heurtel, Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, for the passage of Bill 104, An Act to increase the number of zero-emission motor vehicles in Québec in order to reduce greenhouse gas and other pollutant emissions.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Jean (Chicoutimi), together with Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for the Status of Women, Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly applaud the thousands of people who are demonstrating throughout Québec today to denounce rape culture;

THAT it commend this show of solidarity toward women, which allows them to speak out and raise public awareness so as to put an end to this violence and the silence surrounding it;

THAT the Members of the National Assembly reiterate the urgent need to enlist all means, including budgetary measures, to implement the Government strategy to prevent and fight sexual violence. After the debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour), together with Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), moved a motion concerning Oriens Technologies; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Pursuant to Standing Order 129, Mr. Billette, Chief Government Whip, moved:

THAT the Member for La Prairie be named a permanent member of the Committee on Health and Social Services in substitution for the Member for Lafontaine;

THAT the Member for Beauce-Sud be named a permanent member of the Committee on Public Finance in substitution for the Member for La Prairie;

THAT these changes take effect immediately.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved a motion concerning the Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- -- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 70, An Act to allow a better match between training and jobs and to facilitate labour market entry;
- the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 105, An Act to amend the Education Act;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 62, An Act to foster adherence to State religious neutrality and, in particular, to provide a framework for religious accommodation requests in certain bodies;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 87, An Act to facilitate the disclosure of wrongdoings within public bodies.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall meet to elect its Chair;
- the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining an order of initiative.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

At 11.31 o'clock a.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to freeze medical specialists' and general practitioners' remuneration from now until such time as this remuneration reflects Quebecers' capacity to pay;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to reinvest the amounts freed up in health and social services.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; approximately 52 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 20 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 40 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the end of his address, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Taillon be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph: "THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to develop a new method of remunerating physicians based on better weighting capitation, salary and fee-for-service payments in order to improve health care quality and increase coverage for all Quebecers."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to freeze medical specialists' and general practitioners' remuneration from now until such time as this remuneration reflects Quebecers' capacity to pay;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to reinvest the amounts freed up in health and social services;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to establish a new method of remunerating physicians based on better weighting capitation, salary and fee-for-service payments in order to improve health care quality and increase coverage for all Quebecers.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Khadir (Mercier), subject to the permission of its author. Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) refused the amendment proposed by Mr. Khadir (Mercier).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 27 October 2016 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 5.01 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 27 October 2016 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
