#### Moment of reflection

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request for an urgent debate from Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader, concerning the justice system's lack of resources, which is jeopardizing many legal proceedings because of the time it takes for cases to come to trial.

#### RULING FROM THE CHAIR

To rule on the receivability of a request for an urgent debate, the Chair must validate that it concerns a specific, important matter that falls under the Assembly's jurisdiction. In addition, the matter must concern a sudden, acute crisis or the worsening of such a crisis. The Chair must also consider whether the matter was addressed under other circumstances and whether there will be other opportunities to discuss it.

In this case, the request for an urgent debate concerns a specific, important matter that falls under the Assembly's jurisdiction. The matter is in the news, and the crisis has been addressed during Oral Questions and Answers several times in recent days. However, the Chair must determine whether the crisis is sudden and acute or whether it is an existing crisis that is worsening within the meaning of parliamentary jurisprudence. Nothing in this request highlights a sudden worsening of the situation, which is the criterion that must be considered under these circumstances. Furthermore, there is still one week of parliamentary proceedings to come.

Since there has been no sudden worsening of the crisis that would justify holding an urgent debate taking precedence over the legislative program, this request cannot be declared receivable.
