#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on drinking water infrastructure problems in Municipalité des Îles-de-la-Madeleine; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), together with Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on setting up a project office for a third link between Québec City and Lévis; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning undocumented immigrants; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 102, An Act to amend the Environment Quality Act to modernize the environmental authorization scheme and to amend other legislative provisions, in particular to reform the governance of the Green Fund;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 98, An Act to amend various legislation mainly with respect to admission to professions and the governance of the professional system.

THAT, within the framework of the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 98, An Act to amend various legislation mainly with respect to admission to professions and the governance of the professional system, the National Assembly pledge to examine the proposed amendments aimed at integrating newcomers into the workforce presented by the Leader of the Official Opposition on Monday, 6 February 2017.

- the second, on a question from Mr. Bourcier (Saint-Jérôme) to Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, on financing contracts for electric school buses. Mr. Lessard, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, replaced the Minister for this debate.

At 6.22 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

**Government Bills** 

Passage in Principle

Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved that Bill 130, An Act to amend certain provisions regarding the clinical organization and management of health and social services institutions, do now pass in principle. A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Khadir (Mercier).
