Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 22 February 2017, on the motion moved by Mrs. Jean (Chicoutimi) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, within the framework of the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 98, An Act to amend various legislation mainly with respect to admission to professions and the governance of the professional system, the National Assembly pledge to examine the proposed amendments aimed at integrating newcomers into the workforce presented by the Leader of the Official Opposition on Monday, 6 February 2017.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), together with Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on the Highway 19 project; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), together with Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly denounce Parks Canada's decision to transfer millions of artifacts to Gatineau;

THAT the Assembly ask the Government to demand that our artifacts stay in our National Capital or in the Micmac Nation.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), together with Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion on maintaining corporate head offices in Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 126, An Act to foster the financial health and sustainability of the Pension Plan of Management Personnel and to amend various legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 122, An Act mainly to recognize that municipalities are local governments and to increase their autonomy and powers;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 98, An Act to amend various legislation mainly with respect to admission to professions and the governance of the professional system;

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 102, An Act to amend the Environment Quality Act to modernize the environmental authorization scheme and to amend other legislative provisions, in particular to reform the governance of the Green Fund;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 115, An Act to combat maltreatment of seniors and other persons of full age in vulnerable situations.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining petitions;
- the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting to organize the next steps of the Committee's mandate to examine the report on implementation of the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly*.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 17 March 2017, Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) would question Mrs. de Santis, Minister responsible for Access to Information and the Reform of Democratic Institutions, during an interpellation on the nomination and appointment process for positions requiring the vote of two-thirds of the Members of the Assembly.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved that Bill 118, An Act respecting medical laboratories, orthopedic service centres and respiratory physiology centres operated by an entity other than a health and social services institution, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 118 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 118 be referred to the Committee on Health and Social Services for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Tuesday, 14 March 2017 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
