THAT the National Assembly reaffirm that it never acceded to the *Constitution Act, 1982*, whose effect was to lessen the powers and rights of Québec without the consent of the Québec Government, of the National Assembly, and that this Act is still unacceptable for Québec. By leave of the Assembly under Standing Order 84, a debate arose thereon.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:
