Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), together with Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on overseeing the prescription and distribution of opioids; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, together with Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec congratulate the 16 consumer associations and Mrs. Isabelle Ducas, journalist with La Presse, recipients of the 2017 "Prix de l'Office de la protection du consommateur" award and "Mention de l'Office de la protection du consommateur" respectively;

THAT the Assembly acknowledge their contribution to heightening consumer awareness and promoting consumer caution;

THAT, lastly, it highlight the practical assistance that consumer associations located outside large urban centres provide to citizens coping with debt problems.

THAT the National Assembly receive and applaud the quality of the report from the Committee on Public Finance on the tax haven phenomenon entitled "Le phénomène du recours aux paradis fiscaux – Observations, conclusions et recommandations":

THAT the Assembly reiterate its concern about the impact of tax evasion and tax avoidance on Québec's ability to properly fund all of its missions;

THAT it urge the Government to quickly introduce an action plan to ensure that the report's recommendations, in particular those related to public contract awarding, are implemented.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Heurtel, Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, moved that Bill 131, An Act to amend the Act respecting compensation measures for the carrying out of projects affecting wetlands or bodies of water, do now pass in principle.
