The Assembly was called to order at 1.40 o'clock p.m.

ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Moment of reflection

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request for an urgent debate from Mrs. Hivon (Joliette). This request concerns the effects of the Jordan decision on the Québec justice system.

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request for an urgent debate from Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) on the Jordan decision's effects on Québec's judicial system.

To be receivable, a request for an urgent debate must concern a specific, important matter that falls under the Assembly's jurisdiction and that concerns a sudden, acute crisis or the worsening of such a crisis. The Chair must also take into consideration whether the matter has been discussed in other circumstances and whether there will be upcoming opportunities to do so.

In this case, the request for an urgent debate does concern a specific, important matter that falls under the Assembly's jurisdiction. The Chair recalls that the Official Opposition House Leader asked for an urgent debate on this subject, which has been in the news for several months, on 2 December 2016. At the time, the Chair concluded that the request was out of order, since nothing submitted indicated a sudden worsening of the situation.

It is true that, for the first time in Québec, a person accused of murder has obtained a stay of proceedings on the basis of the Jordan decision criteria. However, the possibility that the Supreme Court of Canada ruling could have such effects has existed since 2016, when the Court handed down its decision in the case, and was raised by the Chief Justice of the Superior Court last December.

The Jordan decision is the source of the issue underlying the request for an urgent debate, since a stay of proceedings in a trial is not, within the meaning of parliamentary law, a sudden worsening of the situation. Rather, in the case at hand, it is a consequence of the Jordan decision, which some would qualify as predictable.

Without trivializing the consequences of the decision, the Chair notes that the situation does not meet the criteria established by jurisprudence with regard to a request for an urgent debate.

For the last nine months, the Jordan decision has been in the news and will most likely continue to be in the future. Because this situation is ongoing, not every stay of proceedings under the decision can be considered a sudden worsening of the situation within the meaning of parliamentary law.

As a result, based on the criteria established by jurisprudence, the request for an urgent debate must be declared out of order.

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 5 April 2017, on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier), Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Roberge (Chambly), Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), subject to the receivability of these motions.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 276, Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) commented on behalf of the Second Opposition Group.

The debate being concluded, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable.

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for cutting public services and increasing Quebecers' tax burden over the last three years and for tabling a budget proposing partial reinvestment in these services and incomplete reimbursement to Quebecers.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Yeas: 42 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Bonnardel (Granby). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for having considerably increased the tax burden on Québec families since beginning its term in office.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Yeas: 42 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec censure the Liberal Government for its 2017–2018 budget, which postpones seriously beginning the transition to greater energy efficiency and more environment-friendly methods, which favours the metropolitan electric network (REM) project to the detriment of real public transit needs and which jeopardizes the goal of achieving Québec's greenhouse gas emission reduction targets for 2020 and 2030.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for cutting public services over the last three years while continuing to give hundreds of millions of dollars to physicians.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for cutting public services over the last three years under the pretext of a fictitious \$7 billion deficit.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
