Deferred Divisions

Mr. Paradis (Lévis), together with Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning average emergency room wait times for patients on stretchers; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning the Constitution Act, 1982; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), together with Mr. Pagé (Labelle) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning the Canadian Government's legalization of marijuana for recreational use; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Living, Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Autism Awareness Month, whose theme is "Light it up Blue";

THAT it recognize the importance of educating and informing the public about autism spectrum disorder and the needs of people with autism and their families;

THAT the National Assembly invite the people of Québec to show their support and participate in the March for Autism that will take place in several regions on 19 April 2017.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 126, An Act to foster the financial health and sustainability of the Pension Plan of Management Personnel and to amend various legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in on division.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Transportation and the Environment on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 131, An Act to amend the Act respecting compensation measures for the carrying out of projects affecting wetlands or bodies of water.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in on division.

Passage

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 230, Mr. Heurtel, Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, moved the passage of Bill 131, An Act to amend the Act respecting compensation measures for the carrying out of projects affecting wetlands or bodies of water.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 131 was passed.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 12 April 2017, on the motion to divide moved by Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), within the framework of the passage in principle of Bill 122, An Act mainly to recognize that municipalities are local governments and to increase their autonomy and powers, moved by Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion to divide moved by Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion to divide, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Yeas: 29 Nays: 52 Abstentions: 0

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, that Bill 122, An Act mainly to recognize that municipalities are local governments and to increase their autonomy and powers, do now pass in principle.

At the end of his address, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) moved the following hoist motion:

THAT the motion under debate be amended by striking out the word "now" and by adding at the end thereof the words "this day six months hence".

The hoist motion was ruled in order.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to the limited debate on this hoist motion: 56 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 4 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each for the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes for the two Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière).

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque).

At 5.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 25 April 2017 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
