The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 17 May 2017, on the motion moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec Government to repatriate Québec's share of the Canada Infrastructure Bank budget from the Federal Government;

THAT it call for the establishment of a Québec Infrastructure Bank.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, and after consultation with Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and the independent Members, moved:

THAT, in accordance with sections 62, 63 and 66 of the Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly (chapter C-23.1), Me Ariane Mignolet, Director General of Legal and Parliamentary Affairs of the National Assembly of Québec, be appointed Ethics Commissioner for a five-year term, effective 29 May 2017, and that her conditions of employment be those tabled in the appendix.

Mr. Couillard, Premier, then tabled the following:

Me Ariane Mignolet's résumé, her conditions of employment and an excerpt from the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly*. (Sessional Paper No. 3243-20170518)

The question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was taken as required for the application of the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly*.

Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on National Patriots' Day; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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Mr. Lemay (Masson), together with Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion to hold a public consultation on the proposed nuclear waste disposal facility in Chalk River; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the shortfall of the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec, cultural institutions and Québec artists; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to undertake clauseby-clause consideration of Bill 122, An Act mainly to recognize that municipalities are local governments and to increase their autonomy and powers;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 130, An Act to amend certain provisions regarding the clinical organization and management of health and social services institutions;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 98, An Act to amend various legislation mainly with respect to admission to professions and the governance of the professional system;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to hear the interested parties and undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Private Bill 223, An Act respecting the continuance of The Livestock Breeders' Association of the District of Beauharnois Inc.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following committee:

 the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 137, An Act respecting the Réseau électrique métropolitain.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

 the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining certain petitions.

At the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

At 12.43 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

At 6.07 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque) to Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, about the situation regarding the Mayor of Baie-Trinité.
