Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 18 May 2017, on the motion moved by Mrs. Charbonneau, Minister responsible for Seniors and Anti-Bullying, for the passage of Bill 115, An Act to combat maltreatment of seniors and other persons of full age in vulnerable situations.

Accordingly, Bill 115 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), together with Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on "special planning zone" status for the regional county municipalities of Deux-Montagnes and Argenteuil; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides), together with Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mrs. Roy (Montarville), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly highlight the fact that, since 2012 Québec has become the Canadian province to welcome the most immigrants from Central and South America;

THAT it underscore that Québec currently has over 150,000 inhabitants who identify themselves as being of Latin American origin;

THAT it recognize the considerable social, economic, political and cultural contributions the Latin American community makes to Québec society today and that these contributions represent an integral part of our collective heritage;

Lastly, that the National Assembly acknowledge that the expression of different cultural identities and the promotion of Latin American culture in Québec have benefited and continue to benefit Québec society as a whole, constituting collective wealth that contributes to successful coexistence.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning the problem of discrimination with regard to hiring persons of immigrant origin; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), together with Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning the Occupied Palestinian Territories; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

- the Committee on Institutions, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 138, An Act to amend the Code of Penal Procedure and the Courts of Justice Act to promote access to justice and the reduction of case processing times in criminal and penal matters; and then, undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 113, An Act to amend the Civil Code and other legislative provisions as regards adoption and the disclosure of information;

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 137, An Act respecting the Réseau électrique métropolitain;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to hear the interested parties and undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Private Bill 227, An Act concerning Ville de Gatineau's project for a complex housing an arena and community ice rinks.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 31 May 2017, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that, increasingly frequently, persons charged with a criminal offence are being released following a stay of proceedings justified by the Jordan ruling;

THAT the Assembly declare that protection of victims and public confidence in the justice system must be priorities;

THAT it ask Members to pass Bill 890 as soon as possible.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Heurtel, Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, moved that Bill 132, An Act respecting the conservation of wetlands and bodies of water, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
