Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Mr. Spénard (Beauce-Nord), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion concerning citizens' right to protest; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Roy (Montarville), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning an amendment of the Minister of Justice to section 3 of Bill 62; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for the Status of Women, together with Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved: THAT the National Assembly mark the 36th Day of Action on Sexual Violence Against Women, held on Friday, 15 September 2017;

THAT the Assembly acknowledge the remarkable work that organizations, women's groups and volunteers do to support women who are victims of violence;

THAT it encourage victims to report all forms of sexual violence to the appropriate authorities;

THAT the Assembly agree that it is our responsibility, both women and men, to act to prevent and counter these heinous acts;

THAT it remind the government departments involved in the government strategy to prevent and fight sexual violence of the importance of implementing the various measures to this effect;

THAT it reiterate the importance of denouncing and fighting all forms of violence against women;

Lastly, that the Members of the National Assembly reaffirm that violence against women is unacceptable.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved a motion concerning the public consultation on systemic discrimination and racism; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 99, An Act to amend the Youth Protection Act and other provisions;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 62, An Act to foster adherence to State religious neutrality and, in particular, to provide a framework for religious accommodation requests in certain bodies.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining a petition;
- the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining an order of initiative.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Transportation and the Environment on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 137, An Act respecting the Réseau électrique métropolitain, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Lessard, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques).

The amendments were declared in order, except the amendment proposed by Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet), which was declared out of order because it amends a section of the *Transport Act* not previously amended by the bill, thus broadening its scope, and one of the amendments proposed by Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), which was declared out of order because it introduces a new element to section 51 of the bill, which exceeds its scope.

After debate thereon, the amendment proposed by Mr. Lessard, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, was carried.

The amendments proposed by Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) were negatived.

The amended report was concurred in on division.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 121, An Act to increase the autonomy and powers of Ville de Montréal, the metropolis of Québec, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin).

The amendments were declared in order.

After debate thereon, the amendments were negatived.

The report was concurred in.

At 12.53 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the widespread discontent that the public consultation on systemic discrimination and racism is causing among many Québec organizations, groups and citizens;

THAT the Assembly demand that the Government of Québec cancel the public consultation on systemic discrimination and racism;

THAT the Assembly ask the Government to immediately implement concrete measures to fight racism and discrimination.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; approximately 50 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 29 minutes 10 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 20 minutes 50 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
