Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), together with Mr. Pagé (Labelle), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning tax management of cannabis sales; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

THAT the National Assembly, like the UN Secretary-General and the Office of the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, denounce the fact that the United Nations and its partners have still not been authorized by the Myanmar Government to visit certain areas of Rakhine state, where security operations continue, even as Rohingya minority refugees flee the violence in Myanmar at a frantic rate, their numbers being estimated at more than 412,000 and growing;

THAT the National Assembly recall that minority rights must be central to any democratic project that is respectful of human rights.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Passage

Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moved the passage of Bill 121, An Act to increase the autonomy and powers of Ville de Montréal, the metropolis of Québec.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 121 was passed.

At 3.08 o'clock p.m., the President welcomed the Premier of Ontario, Mrs. Kathleen Wynne, to the National Assembly Chamber and invited her to address the Members of the National Assembly.

The proceedings resumed at 4.14 o'clock p.m.

At 4.15 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 26 September 2017 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
