#### **Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly**

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 27 September 2017, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Rochon (Richelieu).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall the risks associated with oil and gas drilling under rivers, lakes and the St. Lawrence River, near homes and public buildings, in endangered species' critical habitats and on the outskirts of national parks;

THAT it demand the immediate withdrawal of the regulations governing petroleum exploration, production and storage activities on Québec soil;

THAT it ask the Québec Government to immediately prepare a new draft regulation aimed, among other things, at prohibiting hydraulic fracturing, chemical stimulation and any other similar process throughout Québec.
