Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 27 September 2017, on the motion moved by Mr. Rochon (Richelieu) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall the risks associated with oil and gas drilling under rivers, lakes and the St. Lawrence River, near homes and public buildings, in endangered species' critical habitats and on the outskirts of national parks;

THAT it demand the immediate withdrawal of the regulations governing petroleum exploration, production and storage activities on Québec soil;

THAT it ask the Québec Government to immediately prepare a new draft regulation aimed, among other things, at prohibiting hydraulic fracturing, chemical stimulation and any other similar process throughout Québec.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) moved a motion concerning setting the legal age for purchasing cannabis at 21; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, on behalf of Mrs. Charbonneau, Minister responsible for Seniors and Anti-Bullying, Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Lifestyles, together with Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Day of Older Persons, to be held on 1 October 2017;

THAT, on this occasion, the Assembly acknowledge the essential contribution older persons make to the development of Québec society, in all spheres, and the need for promoting active ageing and a healthy, safe living environment for all seniors;

THAT the Assembly highlight the importance of the Day's theme, Ageing Well Together, which clearly expresses our common desire to build an inclusive society enriched by the contribution of all generations composing it—a Québec for all ages;

THAT, lastly, it invite Quebecers to participate in the events organized for International Day of Older Persons in their region.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the option of using federal income taxes, paid by Quebecers, to pay the countervailing duties imposed by the US administration on purchases of Bombardier C Series aircraft is neither viable nor valid.

THAT the presentation by each individual or organization last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 35 minutes, allocated as follows: 17 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 10 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and 7 minutes to the Second Opposition Group;

THAT the Minister of Justice be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, moved that Bill 144, An Act to amend the Education Act and other legislative provisions concerning mainly free educational services and compulsory school attendance, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Report Stage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 27 September 2017, on consideration of the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 99, An Act to amend the Youth Protection Act and other provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 12.33 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) to Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, on the Québec Ombudsman's annual report. Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Living, replaced the Minister for this debate.

At 6.11 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 3 October 2017 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
