Deferred Divisions

THAT it reiterate the importance of not trivializing cannabis consumption and of sending a clear message as to the risks such consumption poses to the health and development of young persons;

THAT it propose to set the legal age for buying cannabis and its derivatives at 21.

DIRECTIVE FROM THE CHAIR

Under Standing Order 254, when the debate on consideration of the Committee's report has concluded, the question shall be put on the amendments severally in such manner as the President shall specify. For many years, the established practice has generally been to put the question on the amendments as a whole so as to reduce the number of recorded divisions.

At a meeting of the House leaders held before the debate on consideration of the Committee's report, it was agreed that, exceptionally, when the debate had concluded, the question would be put on the amendments severally. However, there was no decision to read the text of each individual amendment before each question was put.

The Chair recalls that, as is always the case when considering a committee report, amendments transmitted by Members are sent to all parliamentary groups and independent Members so that they can read them. This was done in the case at hand. The Members could read the amendments between the time they were forwarded and the time the question was put thereon.

The Chair stresses that the Standing Orders provide for a different procedure only in the context of an exceptional legislative procedure, for example, when the deadline for transmitting amendments is much shorter. In this regard, Standing Order 257.7 explicitly states that the Chair shall read each amendment before the question is put thereon.

The Chair therefore invites the Members to proceed with the vote on the various amendments.
