Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), together with Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion concerning the compulsory sex education class in Québec's elementary and secondary schools; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), together with Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion concerning the awarding of an untendered contract to Air Inuit; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Montpetit, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mrs. Samson (Iberville), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion), moved:

THAT the National Assembly honour the memory of Mr. Dan S. Hanganu, a renowned architect, whose creations have marked Québec;

THAT it highlight the undeniable contribution his landmark works, such as HEC Montréal's Côte-Sainte-Catherine building, the Pointe-à-Callière museum, the Bibliothèque Monique Corriveau in Québec City and the Saint-Benoît-du-Lac Abbey, have had on shaping Québec's architectural landscape;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in his memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Hivon (Joliette), Mrs. Guilbault (Louis-Hébert), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on childcare centres; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

- the Committee on Institutions, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 139, An Act to group the Office Québec/Wallonie-Bruxelles pour la jeunesse, the Office Québec-Amériques pour la jeunesse and the Office Québec-Monde pour la jeunesse.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) moved:

THAT Bill 992, An Act to amend the Public Administration Act and other legislative provisions to make deputy ministers and chief executive officers accountable for their government department's or public body's efficiency, do pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
