The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), together with Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Living, Mr. Pagé (Labelle), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the national public health director to investigate cases of poisoning caused by consuming beverages high in sugar and alcohol, especially by young people;

THAT the Minister for Public Health report to the National Assembly on the conclusions and recommendations of this investigation as soon as possible.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David, Minister responsible for Higher Education, together with Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), Mr. Roberge (Chambly), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 50th anniversary of the CEGEP system;

THAT the Assembly underline the contribution CEGEPs have made to Québec's economic, social and cultural development;

THAT it reiterate the important role CEGEPs play in educating creative, innovative and committed citizens;

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, moved that Bill 134, An Act mainly to modernize rules relating to consumer credit and to regulate debt settlement service contracts, high-cost credit contracts and loyalty programs, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 134 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 134 be referred to the Committee on Citizen Relations for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, moved that Bill 107, An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner and the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes and expand the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses, do now pass in principle.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, for the passage in principle of Bill 107, An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner and the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes and expand the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses. At the end of his speech, Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved the following motion to divide the said Bill:

THAT, pursuant to Standing Order 241, Bill 107, An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner and the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes and expand the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses, be divided into three bills, the first of which shall be entitled "An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner" and shall comprise sections 1 to 22, 41, 43 to 46 and 47, except the words ", except sections 28 to 32, 34 and 35, which come into force on the dates to be set by the Government"; the second of which shall be entitled "An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes" and shall comprise sections 23 to 37 and 47; and the third of which shall be entitled "An Act respecting the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses" and shall comprise sections 38 to 40, 42 and 47, except the words ", except sections 28 to 32, 34 and 35, which come into force on the dates to be set by the Government".

At 4.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 4.17 o'clock p.m.

At 4.24 o'clock p.m., after hearing arguments from all sides regarding the receivability of the motion to divide, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, took the matter under advisement and suspended the proceedings.

The proceedings resumed at 5.45 o'clock p.m.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, ruled on the receivability of the motion to divide moved by Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia).

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

Over the years, jurisprudence has established numerous criteria for determining the receivability of motions to divide. Having referred to these criteria and read the bill's provisions, the Chair notes that the bill contains more than one principle. That being said, the Chair must still determine if the way the sections are divided among the different bills resulting from the division generates separate bills that are coherent and can be considered independently.

For bills resulting from division to be coherent and able to stand alone, the provisions relating to principles contained in the new bills must follow the principle to which they belong. The motion to divide, as drafted, links section 39 to the third bill resulting from the division, entitled "An Act respecting the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses". This section constitutes a provision linked to the Associate Commissioner for Investigations, a concept linked to the first bill resulting from the division, on the Anti-Corruption Commissioner. Consequently, this provision is unrelated to and inconsistent with the bill resulting from the division in which it appears. In other words, one of the provisions is not linked to the principle from which it stems.

Accordingly, the motion to divide is declared out of order.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, for the passage in principle of Bill 107, An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner and the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes and expand the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Spénard (Beauce-Nord).

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) to Mr. Lessard, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, about the shelved Boucherie Richard Morin Incorporée inspection reports.
