Business Having Precedence

Want of Confidence Motion

Mr. Cholette (Hull), on behalf of Mr. Charest, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely blame the Parti Québécois Government, which is proceeding without having the mandate to do so as regards forced municipal fusions. Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Brouillet, Vice-President, announced the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this want of confidence motion: fifteen minutes shall be allotted for a reply by its mover and ten minutes shall be set aside for the independent Member, and the two parliamentary groups shall share equally the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group may be added to that of the other group while any time not used by the independent Member shall be redistributed amongst the parliamentary groups, and individual addresses shall not otherwise be limited.

And debate arising on the motion by Mr. Cholette (Hull);

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Boisclair, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Debates Upon Adjournment

The Assembly held a debate upon adjournment between Mr. Gautrin (Verdun) and Mr. Boisclair, Minister of Social Solidarity, about the dissipation of the pension funds of our seniors.

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 24 October 2000, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
