#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly applaud the historic speech its President gave on 31 October 2017 to defend parliamentarians' rights and privileges.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Spénard (Beauce-Nord), together with Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on Bill 107, An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner and the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes and expand the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Anglade, Minister of Economy, Science and Innovation, together with Mrs. Montpetit, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet), Mr. Lamontagne (Johnson), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the recipients of the 40th "Prix du Québec" awards, who have greatly advanced our society in the fields of culture and science;

THAT it highlight their creativity and know-how and the fact that they are role models in their respective fields;

THAT it recognize their brilliant careers and influence, both nationally and internationally.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) moved a motion on negotiations between the Association of Employees of Northern Quebec and the Kativik School Board to reach a new collective agreement; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 134, An Act mainly to modernize rules relating to consumer credit and to regulate debt settlement service contracts, highcost credit contracts and loyalty programs;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 108, An Act to facilitate oversight of public bodies' contracts and to establish the Autorité des marchés publics.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, gave the following notice:

the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to prepare the hearing of the Autorité des marchés financiers on chapter 2 of the Auditor General of Québec's spring 2017 report, entitled "Autorité des marchés financiers: activités de contrôle et Fonds d'indemnisation des services financiers"; then, hold a public meeting to hear the Autorité des marchés financiers; and finally, hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the observations, conclusions and recommendations, if any, following this hearing.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Fortin, Minister of Families, moved that Bill 143, An Act to improve the educational quality and foster the harmonious development of educational childcare services, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 143 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 143 be referred to the Committee on Citizen Relations for clause-by-clause consideration.

#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader, moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask that appointment of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner henceforth require the approval of two-thirds of the Members.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 50 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 28 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 26 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
