Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), together with Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the extraordinary career of Mrs. Régine Laurent, outgoing President of the Fédération interprofessionnelle de la santé du Québec (FIQ);

THAT the Assembly applaud the fight she has fought for over 30 years of union activism to improve working conditions for nurses, respiratory therapists and perfusionists;

THAT it highlight the unwavering commitment to our public health and social services system she showed in her eight years as FIQ President;

THAT, lastly, it express its fullest recognition to Mrs. Régine Laurent for her contribution to the advancement of women, persons from cultural communities and male and female workers in our society.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David, Minister responsible for the Status of Women, together with Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, held on 25 November 2017;

THAT the Assembly recognize that all acts of violence against girls and women causing physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering are unacceptable;

THAT it acknowledge that violence against women is exacerbated by gender stereotypes and by trivializing sexism;

THAT, lastly, it use this opportunity to underscore the historic importance of the many women that have joined fervently in the fight to defend their most fundamental rights and contribute to the advancement of our society.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), together with Mr. Moreau, Minister responsible for the Gaspésie–Îles-de-la-Madeleine region, Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) and Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the increasing importance of fishery products in human nutrition worldwide;

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the essential economic contribution of the fishing and aquaculture industry in maritime Québec, especially in the Gaspésie–Îles-de-la-Madeleine region;

THAT the National Assembly recognize that research and development in the field of fisheries and aquaculture must continue uninterrupted and is essential for the Québec fishery and aquaculture industry to remain competitive nationally as well as internationally;

THAT the National Assembly confirm that École des pêches et d'aquaculture de Grande-Rivière is essential and unique within the network of Québec's five national schools;

THAT the National Assembly recognize the need to ensure the sustainability and competiveness of this institution, the only one of its kind in Québec, that has been located in Grande-Rivière in Gaspésie since 1948.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mrs. David, Minister responsible for Higher Education, moved that Bill 151, An Act to prevent and fight sexual violence in higher education institutions, do now pass in principle.
