Motions Without Notice

Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), together with Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the production of the cannabis sold by the Société québécoise du cannabis; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women, held today, 6 December;

THAT it use this opportunity to commemorate and pay tribute to the 14 young women who were assassinated on 6 December 1989 at the École Polytechnique de Montréal;

THAT the Assembly reiterate that violence against women is unacceptable and that it applaud the work of those who implement initiatives to prevent this violence, in all its forms, and to support the victims;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on maintaining the farmland status of property formerly belonging to the Sisters of Charity; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mr. Cloutier (Lac-Saint-Jean), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the investment of surpluses accumulated in the education system; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

- the Committee on Culture and Education, to hear the interested parties and undertake clause-by-clause consideration of these private bills in the following order: Bill 224, An Act respecting the parcelling out of a lot located partly in the Maison Louis-Degneau (former Maison Prévost) and Maison de Saint-Hubert (former Maison des Sœurs-du-Sacré-Cœurde-Jésus) protection areas; Bill 234, An Act to amend the Charter of the Université de Montréal;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to hear the interested parties and undertake clause-by-clause consideration of these private bills in the following order: Bill 230, An Act respecting Municipalité de Notre-Dame-des-Pins; Bill 233, An Act respecting an immovable located on Boulevard Décarie in Montréal;

 the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to undertake clause-byclause consideration of Bill 149, An Act to enhance the Québec Pension Plan and to amend various retirement-related legislative provisions.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, gave the following notice:

 the Committee on Citizen Relations shall hold a public meeting to undertake special consultations and public hearings within the framework of the order of initiative on women's place in politics.
