The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Roberge (Chambly), together with Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on the practice of boosting student grades on Ministère de l'Éducation exams; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Anglade, Deputy Premier, together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion), moved:

> THAT the National Assembly deplore the deadly attack that killed 17 people and left many injured yesterday at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida;

THAT it express its sincere condolences to the families and loved ones of the victims of this terrible incident as well as its solidarity with Florida residents;

THAT it deplore shows of violence in our societies and reiterate the importance of gun control as one of the means of preventing such tragedies;

THAT, lastly, the Members of this Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), together with Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on the Ethics and Religious Culture course; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on the health network; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

 the Committee on Culture and Education, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 166, An Act to reform the school tax system;

- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 157, An Act to constitute the Société québécoise du cannabis, to enact the Cannabis Regulation Act and to amend various highway safety-related provisions;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 163, An Act respecting the implementation of recommendations of the pension committee of certain public sector pension plans and amending various legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Institutions, in accordance with section 550 of the *Election Act*, to consider and approve the *Regulation to amend the Nomination Regulation* tabled in the National Assembly.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 149, An Act to enhance the Québec Pension Plan and to amend various retirement-related legislative provisions, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Leclair (Beauharnois) and Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière).

The amendments were declared in order. However, they were identical.

At 11.07 o'clock a.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes to confer with the House Leaders to organize putting the question on the proposed amendments.

The proceedings resumed at 11.14 o'clock a.m.

Pursuant to Standing Order 252 and to avoid repetition, based on the order in which they were received, the question was put only on the amendment transmitted by Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière).

A debate arose on the amendments transmitted by Mr. Leclair (Beauharnois) and Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière) and on the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy.

The debate being concluded, the amendment was negatived.

The report was concurred in.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, moved that Bill 141, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of the financial sector, the protection of deposits of money and the operation of financial institutions, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 141 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 141 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 14 February 2018, on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that Bill 150, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of certain provisions of the Budget Speeches of 17 March 2016 and 28 March 2017, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 150 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 150 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 5.59 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) to Mr. Lessard, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, about the Atlantic Fisheries Fund.

At 6.12 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 20 February 2018 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
