Motions Without Notice

Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on the extension of Autoroute 20 into eastern Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), together with Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved:

THAT the Assembly respond favourably to federal Bill C-452: An Act to amend the *Criminal Code* (exploitation and trafficking in persons) and consider it an asset in the fight against child prostitution and sexual exploitation;

THAT it note that Bill C-452 amends the *Criminal Code* to provide consecutive sentences for offences related to trafficking in persons, create a presumption regarding the exploitation of one person by another, and add the offence of trafficking in persons to the list of offences to which the forfeiture of proceeds of crime apply;

THAT the Assembly note that Bill C-452 was adopted unanimously in the House of Commons on 26 November 2013, was passed in the Senate on 12 May 2015 and received Royal Assent on 18 June 2015;

THAT it note that the current Prime Minister of Canada himself voted in favour of Bill C-452;

THAT the Assembly ask the Federal Government to sign the decree as soon as possible to give effect to all of the provisions of Bill C-452.

The question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 50th anniversary of the creation of the Office franco-québécois pour la jeunesse;

THAT it reiterate the importance of the direct, privileged relationship between Québec and France, and of youth mobility.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) moved a motion on the Desjardins Group's maintaining financial services in regional locations; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

At 11.33 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Paradis (Lévis) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that, according to data published by the Canadian Institute for Health Information, the average remuneration of Québec's medical specialists has exceeded that of their Canadian counterparts since 2014–2015;

THAT it also acknowledge the Health Minister's remarks of 15 February 2018 to the effect that Québec's medical specialists now earn more than Ontario's;

THAT it recognize that Quebecers will pay medical specialists more than necessary and that it therefore ask the Québec Government not to sign the new agreement with the medical specialists before the next general election in 2018.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 50 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 28 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 26 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of her speech, Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Lévis be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the third paragraph: "THAT it request that the Government freeze medical specialists' remuneration."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that, according to data published by the Canadian Institute for Health Information, the average remuneration of Québec's medical specialists has exceeded that of their Canadian counterparts since 2014–2015;

THAT it also acknowledge the Health Minister's remarks of 15 February 2018 to the effect that Québec's medical specialists now earn more than Ontario's;

THAT it recognize that Quebecers will pay medical specialists more than necessary and that it therefore ask the Québec Government not to sign the new agreement with the medical specialists before the next general election in 2018;

THAT it request that the Government freeze medical specialists' remuneration.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Paradis (Lévis) and on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of his address, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Lévis be amended as follows:

By replacing "not to sign the" in the last paragraph by "to sign a";

By adding ", reducing their remuneration to the same level as that of Ontario," after "with the medical specialists" in the last paragraph.

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that, according to data published by the Canadian Institute for Health Information, the average remuneration of Québec's medical specialists has exceeded that of their Canadian counterparts since 2014–2015;

THAT it also acknowledge the Health Minister's remarks of 15 February 2018 to the effect that Québec's medical specialists now earn more than Ontario's;

THAT it recognize that Quebecers will pay medical specialists more than necessary and that it therefore ask the Québec Government to sign a new agreement with the medical specialists, reducing their remuneration to the same level as that of Ontario, before the next general election in 2018.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Paradis (Lévis) and on the amendment motions moved by Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Paradis (Lévis) refused the amendments proposed by Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier).

After debate thereon, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
