#### **Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations**

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request from Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) to be heard on a matter of breach of privilege or contempt.

In his notice, the Member for Groulx alleged that the ad hoc Ethics Commissioner for the Members of the National Assembly, Me Jacques Saint-Laurent, had violated his rights and privileges in the report he tabled on 30 November 2017 regarding the Member. The notice further stated the Member for Groulx's intention to move a motion under Standing Orders 324 and following.

The President took the matter under advisement.

Mrs. Poirier, Official Opposition House Leader, requested a directive on the presence of independent Members and planning examination of the estimates of expenditure in committee.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mrs. Poirier, Official Opposition House Leader, tabled the following:

Copies of two emails, dated 6 and 11 April 2018, about the procedure for examining the 2018–2019 estimates of expenditure in committee.

The President heard the arguments from all sides on the request for a directive raised by Mrs. Poirier, Official Opposition House Leader.

The President indicated that the Standing Orders allow independent Members to participate in examining all components of the estimates of expenditure in committee. He asked the independent Members to indicate the components on which they wished to be heard in advance, without modifying them, so as to better plan the proceedings.

#### **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mrs. Roy (Montarville) tabled the following:

## **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 18 April 2018, on the motion moved by Mr. Blais, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, for the passage in principle of Bill 173, An Act mainly to introduce a basic income for persons with a severely limited capacity for employment.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 173 was passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 173 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), together with Mr. Pagé (Labelle), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the contracts signed by the Société des alcools du Québec for procuring cannabis from the Société québécoise du cannabis; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, together with Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne), Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

> THAT the National Assembly of Québec congratulate the Union des consommateurs, the 2018 winner of the 16th "Prix de l'Office de la protection du consommateur" award;

> THAT it recognize that the Union des consommateurs has, since the early 2000s, played a key role in defending consumer rights;

> THAT it also highlight the quality of the work of Mr. Yves Therrien, reporter for the daily newspaper Le Soleil and winner of the "Mention l'Office" award, for his series of articles on debt and personal finances;

THAT it also applaud both award winners' commitment to consumers, by keeping them informed and raising their awareness regarding the issues they face;

THAT, lastly, it reiterate the remarkable contribution these award winners have made to consumer protection.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on welcoming asylum seekers in Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), together with Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that deepsea fishing is the second most dangerous job in North America;

THAT Fisheries and Oceans Canada's moving the fishing season for certain commercial species up further and further results in increasingly difficult, even perilous, conditions for deepsea fishing activities;

THAT climate change greatly impacts the weather and complicates fishermen's task further still;

THAT increasing the size of commercial fishing boats in recent years, to make them more competitive, among other things, has become common practice;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Canada to assess the impacts of the above-mentioned situation and adapt the Canadian Coast Guard's fleet to ensure maximum safety for deepsea fishermen, especially in Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.
