# **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark National Mental Health Week, held from 7 to 13 May under the banner "Acting to give meaning";

THAT it highlight the work done by health network personnel and organizations that support people with mental health problems;

THAT, lastly, it applaud the activities and workshops implemented to break their isolation and promote their social integration.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) moved a motion on the influx of migrants at Canada's borders; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Estimates of Expenditure**

The Assembly entered upon the limited debate on the reports from the committees that examined the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2019.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 55 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded and the Assembly having disposed of the motions stating a grievance and the motion by the Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy, moved within the framework of the Budget Speech, the question was put for concurrence in the several reports together from the committees that examined the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2019, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
