### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mrs. Goupil, Minister of Justice, moved the passage of Bill 5, An Act to harmonize public statutes with the Civil Code.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 5 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 38, An Act to amend the Civil Code as regards publication of certain rights by means of a notice.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 31, An Act to amend the Code of Civil Procedure.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Goupil, Minister of Justice, moved, —That Bill 54, An Act to amend the Act respecting Attorney General's prosecutors, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and Bill 54 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Brassard, Government House Leader, Bill 54 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Institutions.

Passage

Mrs. Lemieux, Minister of Labour, moved the passage of Bill 50, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards and other legislative provisions concerning work performed by children.

And debate arising;

During the debate, Mrs. Lemieux, Minister of Labour, moved that Bill 50 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of amendments that she specified.

This motion was carried.

On motion by Mrs. Lemieux, Minister of Labour, the Assembly then resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The said amendments were considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

Bill 50, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 50 was passed.

At 11.35 o'clock a.m., by leave of the Assembly, Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, suspended the sitting until 2.00 o'clock p.m.
