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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Montpetit, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mrs. Samson (Iberville), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly strongly and unanimously reaffirm its commitment to freedom of expression as an intrinsic Québec value, in reference to the episode experienced by Montréal's *Vice* newspaper employees and journalists;

THAT it reaffirm freedom of the press as a fundamental value and principle that is essential to our society;

THAT it condemn any act intimidating journalists for their work;

THAT it recall that we live in a democratic, pluralistic, tolerant society.

#### **Government Bills**

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 152, An Act to amend various labour-related legislative provisions mainly to give effect to certain Charbonneau Commission recommendations.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 11.39 o'clock a.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

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#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that significant, and often unjustified, fluctuations in gasoline prices in Québec have a negative impact on Québec families;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to mandate the Competition Bureau of Canada to investigate the widespread gasoline price increases in Québec.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 50 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 28 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 26 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Borduas be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph: "THAT it denounce the Competition Bureau of Canada's refusal to investigate the widespread gasoline price increases in Québec and call for the creation of a Québec consumer protection bureau."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that significant, and often unjustified, fluctuations in gasoline prices in Québec have a negative impact on Québec families;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to mandate the Competition Bureau of Canada to investigate the widespread gasoline price increases in Québec;

THAT it denounce the Competition Bureau of Canada's refusal to investigate the widespread gasoline price increases in Québec and call for the creation of a Québec consumer protection bureau.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), subject to the permission of its author.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, Mr. Moreau, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, tabled the following:

Copies of two graphs entitled "West Texas Intermediate Crude". (Sessional Paper No. 4402-20180530)

At the end of his address, Mr. Moreau, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Borduas be amended as follows:

By adding the following words after the word "recognize" in the first line: "that Quebecers are entitled to expect to pay an acceptable price for the gasoline they buy in Québec and";

By striking out, in the second line, the words ", and often unjustified,";

By replacing, in the second and third lines, the words "in Québec have a negative impact on Québec families" by "have an impact";

By replacing, in the fifth line, the word "mandate" by the words "ensure that";

By replacing, in the sixth line, the words "to investigate the widespread gasoline price increases in Québec" by the words "has the resources necessary to carefully monitor recent fluctuations in gasoline prices in Québec and, if applicable, to report to the National Assembly any warnings based on its observations".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that Quebecers are entitled to expect to pay an acceptable price for the gasoline they buy in Québec and that significant fluctuations in gasoline prices have an impact;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to ensure that the Competition Bureau of Canada has the resources necessary to carefully monitor recent fluctuations in gasoline prices in Québec and, if applicable, to report to the National Assembly any warnings based on its observations.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) and Mr. Moreau, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of his address, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Borduas be amended as follows:

By adding the following, after the second paragraph: "THAT the National Assembly also recognize that the best way to solve the problem is by reducing petroleum product consumption and that developing public transit is essential for achieving this objective."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that significant, and often unjustified, fluctuations in gasoline prices in Québec have a negative impact on Québec families;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to mandate the Competition Bureau of Canada to investigate the widespread gasoline price increases in Québec;

THAT the National Assembly also recognize that the best way to solve the problem is by reducing petroleum product consumption and that developing public transit is essential for achieving this objective.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and on the amendment motions moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Moreau, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) refused the amendments proposed by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Moreau, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, and Mr. Khadir (Mercier).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

#### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, moved the passage of Bill 162, An Act to amend the Building Act and other legislative provisions mainly to give effect to certain Charbonneau Commission recommendations.

A debate arose thereon.

During the debate, Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, moved that Bill 162 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for consideration of two amendments, which she specified.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The motion was carried.

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Committee of the Whole

The amendments to Bill 162 proposed by Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, were considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

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Bill 162, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the report of the Committee of the Whole.

The debate continued on the motion for the passage of Bill 162.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 162 was passed.

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Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 31 May 2018 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
