The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Guilbault (Louis-Hébert), together with Mr. Fortin, Minister of Families, and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize Québec parents' freedom to choose the childcare model best suited to meet their needs and those of their children.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 184, An Act to promote the establishment of a public fast-charging service for electric vehicles, the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources hold special consultations and public hearings on 5 June 2018;

THAT, for this purpose, the Committee hear the following:

Hydro-Québec – The Electric Circuit Association des véhicules électriques du Québec EV and More;

THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for opening statements, allocated as follows: 6 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 3 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and 2 minutes 30 seconds to the Second Opposition Group;

THAT the presentation by each individual or organization last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 35 minutes, allocated as follows: 17 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 10 minutes 30 seconds to the Official Opposition, and 7 minutes to the Second Opposition Group;

THAT the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources be a member of the Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Pagé (Labelle), together with Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on building a casino in Québec City; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), together with Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne), Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the tourism industry's economic importance for all Québec regions;

THAT the National Assembly confirm the relevance and quality of the approach taken by many local and regional Gaspé stakeholders that led to UNESCO recognizing Percé as Québec's first Global Geopark;

THAT the National Assembly recognize the need for all levels of government to actively contribute to maintaining and consolidating the tourism and cultural industry of Percé and all of Gaspésie, in keeping with the objectives set out by UNESCO.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Vien, Minister responsible for Labour, moved that Bill 176, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards and other legislative provisions mainly to facilitate family-work balance, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 176 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 176 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole for the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 186, An Act concerning the acquisition of additional cars for the Montréal subway.
