The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 157, An Act to constitute the Société québécoise du cannabis, to enact the Cannabis Regulation Act and to amend various highway safety-related provisions, together with the amendments transmitted by Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Living, Mr. Pagé (Labelle), Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier).

The amendments were declared in order.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on consideration of the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 157, An Act to constitute the Société québécoise du cannabis, to enact the Cannabis Regulation Act and to amend various highway safety-related provisions, together with the amendments transmitted by Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Living, Mr. Pagé (Labelle), Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier).

The debate being concluded, the amendments proposed by Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Living, were carried.

The amendments proposed by Mr. Pagé (Labelle) to sections 15, 21.1, 21.2 and 54.1, enacted by section 12 of the bill, on questions put severally thereon, were negatived.

The amendments proposed by Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) were negatived.

The report, as amended, was concurred in.

Passage

Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, moved the passage of Bill 185, An Act to defer the next general school election and to allow the Government to provide for the use of a remote voting method.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 185 was passed.

Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, moved the passage of Bill 178, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning consumer protection.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 178 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 140, An Act respecting the services available to a former Prime Minister.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Mr. Fortin, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 7 June 2018 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
