That being said, when a Member targeted by an Ethics Commissioner's report is unable to attend Assembly proceedings, yet wishes to exercise his or her right to be heard by sending a written argument, the Chair deems its role to include ensuring that the Member's rights are respected and allowing the Member to do so.

**Government Bills**

*Debates on Reports from Committees*

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 184, An Act to promote the establishment of a public fast-charging service for electric vehicles.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

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At 11.54 o'clock a.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 21, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

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The proceedings resumed at 12.01 o'clock p.m.

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*Passage*

Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, moved the passage of Bill 141, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of the financial sector, the protection of deposits of money and the operation of financial institutions.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 141 was passed.

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Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, moved the passage of Bill 128, An Act to promote the protection of persons by establishing a framework with regard to dogs.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 128 was passed.

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At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

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The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

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**Government Motions**

The Assembly held the debate on the motion that arose from the tabling of the United Nations Convention against Corruption, on 31 May 2018, by Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie.

This motion reads as follows:

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THAT, pursuant to section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the United Nations Convention against Corruption.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 55 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 34 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried. Accordingly, this commitment was approved.

#### **Debates on Reports from Committees**

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Administration, which met on 7 and 13 February, on 15, 21, 28 and 29 March, on 18 April and on 8, 15 and 31 May 2018 to hear deputy ministers and heads of public bodies on Chapter 4 of the Auditor General of Québec's spring 2017 report entitled "Sylvicultural Work", the administrative management and financial commitments of the Auditor General of Québec, the administrative management of the Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec, the special report by the Public Protector (Québec Ombudsman), entitled "Private seniors' residences: more than just rental businesses", the administrative management and financial commitments of the Ministère de l'Immigration, de la Diversité et de l'Inclusion, and Chapter 5 of the Auditor General of Québec's fall 2017 report, entitled "Integration of Immigrants: Individual Settlement and Integration Support Services", the Auditor General of Québec's special audit, entitled "Special Audit, Ministère des Transports, de la Mobilité durable et de l'Électrification des transports: Contract Management", and to follow up on recommendation 3.1 of the 36th report of the Committee on Public Administration and the 2014–2015 report of the Chair of the Conseil du trésor and Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review on application of the *Public Administration Act*. The report contains observations, conclusions and 16 recommendations.

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Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 55 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 34 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
