BUSINESS HAVING PRECEDENCE

- (1) Resuming the debate, adjourned on **5 December 2018**, on the motion by the Premier, —That this Assembly approves the general policy of the Government,

And on the motions stating a grievance moved by:

The Leader of the Official Opposition:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government for its lack of rigour and for calling into question the accounting principles used by the Ministère des Finances and validated by the Auditor General, thereby undermining citizens' confidence in our institutions and jeopardizing sound management of the State.

The Leader of the Second Opposition Group:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for its lack of concrete, detailed, quantified commitments to improve the services offered to Quebecers.

The Leader of the Third Opposition Group:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for its weak environmental protection guidelines, particularly with regard to fighting climate change and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

The Member for Rimouski:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for its lack of concrete, detailed, quantified commitments to fight poverty in Québec.

The Member for Sherbrooke:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for its lack of an overall vision and coherence with regard to early education and early childhood educational services.

The Member for Saint-Laurent:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government, which refuses to listen to early childhood and education partners regarding the impact that kindergarten classes for all four-year-old children would have on the childcare services and education networks.

The Member for Pontiac:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government for choosing ideology over science and ignoring public health experts regarding the minimum age for the purchase and possession of cannabis.

The Member for Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government, which refuses to recognize that the number one issue for Québec's economic development is the human resources shortage.

The Member for Jonquière:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for its refusal to commit to attaining the 2020 greenhouse gas reduction target.

The Member for Laurier-Dorion:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for its intention to lower immigration targets over the coming years.

The Member for Marguerite-Bourgeoys:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government, which is completely abandoning the most vulnerable members of our society and ignoring the social services needs of citizens and community organizations at a time when it has major budgetary surpluses.

The Member for Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for failing to announce measures supporting the ecological conversion of the agricultural sector.

The Member for René-Lévesque:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for its lack of willingness to support our regions, in particular eastern Québec, and the lack of clear, tangible commitments to promote their development.

The Member for Verdun:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government, which has left Québec's cultural milieu with no response as to maintaining the sums linked to Québec's cultural policy launched by the previous government.

The Member for D'Arcy-McGee:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government and the Premier for lacking a humanist vision of the future of government relations with the First Nations and the Inuit, with whom we share Québec's territory.

The Member for Rosemont:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for the absence of any concrete commitment to reinvest in public services.

The Member for Mercier:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for its project to create a fixed third link between Lévis and Québec City.

- (2) Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) – **6 December 2018**
To the Premier

Since 15 January 2015, the website transparence.gouv.qc.ca has allowed citizens to have access to all public agendas of Cabinet members and, since 1 April 2015, to information relating to meetings with non-government representatives.

At present, the website transparence.gouv.qc.ca is still not functional, that is, there is no information available regarding CAQ ministers, not even public agendas, which previously were to be posted daily.

Yet, the Premier committed to being at the head of a transparent government. When his party was in the opposition, the Member for Borduas and current House Leader stated the following:

“[Translation] When we say that we are a transparent government, it is important to match words with actions. When we speak of the government’s transparency, I think it’s important to truly practice what we preach”.

Consequently:

Will the Premier commit to keeping the website transparence.gouv.qc.ca and at least post the information that was posted there since 2015?

Will he immediately post the information relating to Cabinet members’ public activities since 18 October 2018?

Retroactively to 18 October 2018, will the Premier post the information relating to meetings requested by non-government representatives in which Cabinet Members participate and do so no later than 1 January 2019, as provided for in the established procedure?
