

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), together with Mrs. Charest, Minister for Education, Mrs. (Gaspé), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the victories of Université Laval's Rouge et Or men's football team, which won the Dunsmore Cup and the Vanier Cup, and women's crosscountry team, which won gold at the Canadian championships in Kingston, last season;

THAT it recognize the determination and consistency shown by these university-level athletes, enabling them to be the best in the country;

THAT, lastly, it pay tribute to the players and coaches for their outstanding, commendable season.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier), moved a motion on the procurement process for the MV F.A.Gauthier; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Mr. Charette, Minister of Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly note the data contained in the 2017–2018 Green Fund accounts, according to which the Green Fund shows a just-over-2% reduction in Québec's GHG emissions over the last 5 years; THAT it note Québec's accumulated shortfall in the fight against climate change;

THAT it recognize that recent governments were unable to achieve the GHG reduction targets demanded by the scientific community;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to act decisively to catch up.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

THAT it underscore mediation's contribution to better access to justice.

Government Motions

Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, had read the following motion and recommended it for the Assembly's consideration. Accordingly, Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, moved:

THAT the National Assembly:

Approve the recommendations of the report of the Committee on the remuneration of judges for 2016–2019 on the pension plan of presiding justices of the peace, dated 20 August 2018 and tabled in the National Assembly on 6 December 2018, specifying that partial reimbursement of experts' and lawyers' fees incurred by the Conférence des juges de paix magistrats du Québec is granted without admissions as to the Committee on the remuneration of judges' power to make such recommendations and as to evaluation of the amount determined by the Committee for reimbursement purposes.

At 12.32 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the CAQ Government to formally commit to introducing a bill aimed at ensuring compliance with Québec's climate change obligations and to doing so before proceedings are adjourned in June 2019 so that the bill can undergo consideration.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 54 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 32 minutes 6 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 4 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 4 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to the independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 7 February 2019, at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 17.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 7 February 2019 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
