The Assembly was called to order at 1.40 o'clock p.m.

Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), together with Mrs. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue), moved a motion on GMO labelling; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 13 February 2019, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mrs. Anglade (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note the Premier of Québec's January 29 comments to the effect that the 18,000 immigration files would be processed according to the old rules;

THAT the National Assembly ask the CAQ Government to respect the Premier's commitment and to review the Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness' decision to cancel the 18,000 immigration files already open.

She then informed the Assembly that the motion by the Government House Leader placed on the *Order Paper and Notices* of 5 February 2019, under Standing Order 146, had been withdrawn from the *Order Paper* at his request.
