#### The Member for Laurier-Dorion:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for not committing, in its 2019–2010 budget, to undertake new energy-efficient social housing unit construction projects under the AccèsLogis Program.

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government for its complete lack of vision with respect to development of the blue economy and maritime Québec
