Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the heads of Loto-Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Blais, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Informal Caregivers, together with Mrs. Sauvé (Fabre), Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 14th edition of Québec Meals on Wheels Week, which ran 18 to 22 March 2019;

THAT it reiterate its support for this service, whose goal is to promote the autonomy of seniors and people in situations of vulnerability, while offering respite to informal caregivers;

THAT, lastly, it recall the importance of breaking the social isolation of persons in situations of vulnerability.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the supplement for handicapped children with exceptional care needs; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, moved a motion on the greenhouse gases emitted by Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness, Mrs. Anglade (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) and Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, moved:

> THAT the National Assembly recognize that, while unfortunately no society is free from individual acts of intolerance, xenophobia or racism, the Québec nation is open and welcoming;

> THAT it highlight Québec's rich history of protecting minorities, for example, as the first British colony to grant the same civil rights to Jews as to other citizens in 1832;

THAT it point out the solidarity Quebecers have always shown in welcoming refugees, such as the Jews who were persecuted in Eastern Europe in the early 20th century, the Chinese who were victims of intolerance in British Columbia at the same time, the Vietnamese "boat people" who arrived here in the 1970s and, more recently, the thousands of refugees from Syria, the Congo and Haiti;

THAT it affirm that this openness and sense of hospitality are something we, as Quebecers, are very proud of;

THAT it reiterate that the Québec nation, historically built on a common identity that makes us Quebecers, warmly accepts anyone wishing to join it, take part in it and add their background and cultural heritage to it; THAT, in this regard, the National Assembly firmly denounce any insinuations and accusations depicting Quebecers as an intolerant, xenophobic or racist people.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.
